### The American University of Paris

- The American University of Paris distributed an online survey to the university community in 2008 to gather feedback on campus facilities and buildings.
- The survey was conducted to inform the Board of Trustees about condition of facilities, current use and user needs
- 284 students responded (and 267 alumni)
